



Window Clings

Leader Resource Sheet

Introduction

Window clings are removable “stickers” that adhere to windows or mirrors. They are easy to make, and are a great way to share information, passions, and interests. Ideas for using these in Scouting include:

- Fun art project to share at home for occasions like Mother’s Day, Earth Day, or just art!
- Celebrate Scouting use on Scout Windows or vehicles.
- Troop or Crew logos to make for traveling to identify vehicles.

Directions

You only need two things to make window clings:

1. Puff Paint: Different brands are available, but they will be identified as puff paint. This is available in single tubes or sets.
2. Clear Sheet Protectors

You can make a template either with the computer or drawing on paper before you begin. Put the template in the sheet protector and then fill in the design with the puff paint. Page 2 of this resource sheet is the template used in the video.

Where will it go?

Window clings can go on the inside of a window or the outside of the window. If you are putting the cling on the INSIDE of the window and making anything that is a word, you will need to reverse the image so that from the outside of the window, you can read it. The side that sticks to the window is the side that is smooth and in contact with the clear sheet protector.

Paint and Dry

Fill out your cling as shown on the video, and let it dry for at least two days. The paint needs to be completely dry before peeling it off the clear sheet.

Use your cling, and if you want to use it again, just put it back on the clear sheet for storage.

Write-on Option

If you have detail information for a cling, like a phone number or website, the easiest way is to just make a larger cling without detail and write on it. (See Video)
